ROYAL LIFE SAVING SOCIETY AND RED CROSS. (Keep this handy for your next staff interview).

Effective September 1st. 1968, the Royal Life Saving Society (Ont. Branch) and the Canadian Red Cross. Water Safety Service (Ont. Division) will be running COMBINED Water Safety Instructor Courses. Pre-requisites for Course are 17 years of age and Bronze Medallion and Leader-Patrol Award. The Course will be a little longer and a little more expansive but it is hoped that they may still be held over a two consecutive week en period or a five day period. \$12.00 per course.

Prospective candidates should secure a copy of the Canadian Life Saving Manual and read it prior to the course. Cost is \$3.50 and may be obtained from the Royal Life

Saving Society, 550 Church Street, Toronto 5.

Requalification Clinics will also be held for a period of 10 hours to ensure that all present holders of the Red Cross Instructor Award will also be familiar with the R.L.S.S. Instructor material.
