
We appreciate all the positive feedback that we have received and value the suggestions you have given us for next year's conference keep them coming. Some of these great ideas have included: opening the Exhibit

CAMP PEDIATRIC NURSING POSITION

Integra is a Children's Mental Health Centre which provides a residential adventure therapy program, Camp Towhee, for children who experience social, emotional and behavioural problems related to their learning disabilities.

Our treatment focuses on enhancing children's social and emotional development through providing them with opportunities and support to be part of a social group. Adventure programming is used to reinforce functional change and challenge dysfunctional behaviours.

Camp Towhee serves as a centre for research, practicum placement and continuing education. The staff consists of college and university students, and practitioners in a variety of fields, including social services, education and health.

The nurse is responsible for a holistic approach to health care at camp. This includes the camp environment, the wellness of staff and campers, routine health procedures and care. The nurse is an integral member of the program staff, acting as a resource person and health educator to the camp staff and children.

Under the direction and supervision of the camp pediatric consultant, Dr. Wendy Roberts, Hospital for Sick Children, Child Development Clinic, the nurse implements a *Stimulant Medication Management Program* for children with attention deficits. This program will give you the opportunity to work as a member of a multi-disciplinary team and develop knowledge and experience in the principles of stimulant medication adjustment.
