ADVERTISING FOR STAFF ON THE BASIS OF SEX ONLY

Children's camps that cater to one sex only sometimes have problems in the wording of their advertisements in various publications because of the Ontario Human Rights Code. This Act basically forbids advertising a position open and restricting eligible applicants to one sex. If this is a problem of yours an exemption may be obtained upon application to the Commission. If you have a sound reason for restricting the sex of the staff because of sleeping accommodation or other legitimate reason and wish to restrict any advertising that you do, but find that publications will not accept your ad with the restriction in it - take heart! The Red Cross Ontario Small Craft Safety Committee is now putting out a Bimonthly Publication, "Boat Works" to act as an update for policy and program changes, a forum for Small Craft Safety Course Conductors and Instructors, Committee Reps, and Field Volunteers. ARRANGE NOW FOR ST. JOHN AMBULANCE COURSES

There's still time to have staff and counsellors trained in St. John Ambulance safety-oriented First Aid, as well as in methods of instruction; and remember that if your Camp has Workmen's Compensation Board number, you can arrange to have staff trained at Board expense through St. John Ambulance.

St. John First Aid training can add a margin of safety to your Camp and wilderness trips. Taught with guidelines that apply to camp and camp life, and presented with an emphasis on safety and accident prevention, St. John training changes attitudes, makes its graduates aware of accident potential and stresses the importance of prevention. With a mixture of film, instruction and practice, methods become interesting, easy to learn and to retain.

Adjust the courses to your camp programme for campers or proceamp hours for your staff. There's variety in first-aid as well as Lifesaver courses, some over an extended period, some of only two-and-a-half hours' duration.

TO START THE INSPIRATION BUBBLING

The week before camp is no time to be dreaming up...groping, that is,...subjects for Sunday Services and inspirational discussions, especially for that first Sunday of the season. In these days of stress and lowered standards, it might be clever and helpful to give solid inspirational ideas from the past...suggestions that have come to us through camp directors who have based many talks on the following topics. The interesting background information makes them even more thought-provoking in that the ideas are by no means new:

Richard Rogers wrote the music based on an old quote: Julie Andrews sang it in Sound of Music:

"Nothing comes from nothing, nothing ever does..."

We can see half a dozen messages in this one, Canterbury pilgrims in the 1400's and 1500's mulled over it...

"Never look for great things from self-interest".

A thoughtful assessment of Faith:

"I believe in the Sun, even when it is not shining; I believe in Love, even when I feel it not; I believe in God even when He is silent".

This will provoke endless debate and discussion, and perhaps an entire change of character, a realization of the importance of words: The Greeks quoted it, probably many before them, and it has come down through the ages as:

"Where there is envy, there also goes jealousy; Where there is jealousy, always malice; And malice, as sure as the stars follow each other, turns back to destroy its creator".

Then... some of our favourites:

"I have planted a garden, and have watched it grow and produce, and so

I know what faith is:

I have seen poplar trees swaying in the breeze, and so I know what grace is;

I have heard the cardinals calling, and so I know what music is;

I have seen clouds before a storm, so I know what beauty is;

I have read a book before a wood fire, and so I know what contentment is;

I have seen the miracle of a sunset, so I know what grandeur is;

I have refound a very dear friend, so I know what gratitude is;

And because I have perceived all these things, I know what wealth is".
