

DIRECTOR & SENIOR STAFF CONFERENCE

MARCH 5. 6 & 7th. AT THE SKYLINE HOTEL.

A total of three hundred persons attended the 1970 Conference. The Conference design was drastically changed from past years. Many people did not approve of the new format and therefore did not attend. Those who did participate indicated that the ideas were valid and that refinements should be made in order to make next year's meeting even more exciting.

Those attending the three day Seminar entitled "Who and What are Influencing 'Kids'?" experienced a series of presentations interspersed with discussions. The Seminar began with a video taped discussion between a group of youngsters and the Seminar Chairman, Mr. Bill Riddell of the Ontario Division, Canadian Mental Health Association, Participants were invited to share their interpretations of what was said on the tape. On Thursday evening, Mrs. Linda Sepannen of the Clarke Institute of Psychiatry discussed the purposes of camps and shared some thoughts concerning what a camp program can and should do for the camper. Another of the Conference highlights was the address by Mr. Terry Ryan of the National Film Board. Terry spoke of the City and camp environments, then challenged the group to develop a meaningful program for today's youth in the light of current needs and trends. Christopher's Movie Matinee a National Film Board production made by High School students, was shown and. discussed later that day. On Saturday. participants shared their interpretations of what had occured during the period and some took advantage of the opportunity to "tell it like it is".

Persons attending only the Friday night and Saturday sessions were divided into four groups chaired by Mr. Gord Hodge, Dr. Bruno Morawetz, Mr. Jack Pearse and Mr. Keith Smith. These seminars were designed to highlight topics outlined, as well as those questions specifically asked by the participants.
