ABOUT OUR EDUCATION COMMITTEE..... The questionnaires sent out to our members have now been collated and your Education Committee will be meeting to decide on what action is to be taken. 35 replies were received. This represents less than 25% of our membership and is in itself rather disappointing. Briefly, 26 of the 35 who replied thought we should conduct some form of Counsellor Training. The remaining 9 for one reason or another thought we should not conduct courses for Counsellors.

Late in December 1965, the Ontario Dept. of Labour made a news release via radio and newspapers concerning certain parts of the ONTARIO MINIMUM WAGE ACT that were becoming effectibe December 27, 1965. Some of these pertained to the Northern Ont. zone where many of our member camps are located. Part of this news release spoke of exemptions that were being changed i.e. camp counsellors now coming under the Act -THIS WAS IN ERROR! A member of the O.C.A. executive has checked with the Ont. Dept. of Labour who advised that a correction was issued but many people did not see the correction. WE REPEAT THE ONTARIO MINIMUM WAGE ACT WAS NOT CHANGED BY THE PRESS RELEASE MADE LATE IN DECEMBER..... It was simply a reminder to employers that certain parts of the Act - of which we already have knowledge were becoming effective Dec. 27, 1965. Students working at camps as counsellors and other jobs are still basically exempt from the Act.

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You will have all recently received your notice of membership renewal for 1966. If you pause RIGHT NOW to complete it and send it in to the C.C.A. office, it would make a tremendous difference in time and money spent by the Association. PLEASE DO IT NOW!

The 1966 Directory is now at the printers and should be in your hands before February 1st. It is later this year because of the volume of work that had to be undertaken by the Standards Committee before the proper listings were determined.

The work of the PUBLIC RELATIONS COMMITTEE is like in-camp training; it takes place at every opportunity, and sometimes on short notice to fill an immediate need. Only three requests have reached us for speakers and these have been filled. Releases on the Brief presented to the Select Committee on Youth have been mailed to newspapers, radio commentators and to the editors of organizational magazines, with one article on the Brief prepared by Bruno Morawetz (Camp Ponacka) for the Canadian Camping Magazine.

Most of our press information is now centred on the Conference, information having gone to Howard Galloway of the American Camping Magazine. Negotiations with newspaper reporters, radio and TV programme directors, letters to Provincial Camping Association Presidents and to American Camping Association Branches and to Church camping executives are in

preparation, ready to be sent out with the Conference programmes and registrations when they come off the press.

We are currently in touch with the Ontario Department of Tourism and Information in the hope that we can receive some assistance in setting up an O.C.A. Hospitality Room at the American Camping Association Conference in Chicago. His reply is expected momentarily.
