In an attempt to set clear goals and objectives for the next two years, the members of the "outgoing" and "incoming" Boards and John Thorsen, our representative from the new Ministry of Culture, Tourism and Recreation, with input from previous Board meetings, reports and suggestions from all of the OCA committees and their chairs, the results of a needs assessment that was obtained by phone contact with as many camp members as was possible and the vision of the group around the table, we began what proved to be an interesting and, I believe, worthwhile process. Thanks the leadership of Liz

Greenway, the following OCA priorities were identified:

- 1. Public Awareness of the OCA;
- 2. Response to government policies both proactively and reactively;
- 3. Membership and involvement by those in all of our membership categories;
- 4. Continued improved services to our members.

To achieve success in the above, it has become clear that we may require a larger office staff and increased finances. Jack Goodman has agreed to assume a new portfolio, Fund Raising. He will be assisted by our

Treasurer Adam Kronick and will be looking for a Committee Chair. This committee will examine avenues that we can access. The possibilities include: increased membership; altered fee structures; event sponsors; government grants; endowments; and special events.

The committee will also look at a variety of fund raising projects. Our effectiveness in all of these endeavors depends on the strength of our Regions. We remain committed to their involvement. We recognize a need to bring our central services such as Health Care Workshops, training events

and standards forums to these regions as they are required. In return, our Regional Representatives will have to be willing to reach out to all those involved in camping in order to assist them educationally and, where appropriate, to bring them into our Association. We will be appointing a new Regional Representative in the Ottawa Region because of the addition of Brian Edey to our Board.

At the present time, the OCA is a responsible voice for camping due to the huge constituency of campers we serve. We need your help to make certain that the general public becomes aware of the accomplishments of the OCA. You can help by proudly displaying the OCA logo on all of your promotional material; by telling your potential clients that if they don't choose your camp for their child(ren), they should choose an accredited OCA camp; and by helping the OCA identify potential camp members. In the Toronto area there are at least 175 Day Camps of which only a handful are OCA members. As well, you can increase the awareness of your senior staff of the OCA by informing them of the opportunities that individual membership brings. Perhaps you might consider a subsidy toward their membership fees.

Regarding the new portfolios for the board (see March OCAsional News), please note that Vice President John Jorgenson has agreed to continue his work with the Public Awareness Committee. At our next Advisory Board meeting on April 19th, the Board will report to the committee chairs and reaffirm their direction and involvement.

We are pleased with the successes the OCA has had; we are excited about the challenges that lie ahead. With your support we can accomplish our goals. Ontario Camping Awareness week, April 13 to April 18, is our opening event. Give it your efforts and support. It will be good for our camps, our campers and our association.
