SWIMMING - THE NEW RECERTIFICATION PROCESS

The Red Cross and the Royal Life Saving Society no longer offer joint recertification courses. Each organization now has a different recert process. So how do you recertify?

<u>ED CROSS</u>: Still offers an 8 hour clinic which will recertify you, for two more years as a Red Cross Water Safety Instructor. (There is no written test, but, the candidate must participate in all aspects including a minimum physical requirement, rescue breathing, water entry and conscious victim recovery and tow).

<u>RLSS</u>: Have a brand new 'Credit System'. The RLSS "encourages each instructor to follow his/her own course of professional development using the credit system".

- 1. At your convenience over the two year recertification period, accummulate 3 credits of your choice (at least one must be a life saving award).
- 2. Make sure your credits are validated and send them to the Branch Office with a \$5.00 recertification fee.
- 3. You receive your new Instructor card valid for another two years plus RLSS program update information.

Also, this credit method offers a one-day certification program, but together by the affiliates, if such is more convenient.

For more detailed information contact your local Red Cross or RLSS offices.
