Third Party Medicals

The OCA office has received a note of clarification from the Ontario Ministry of Health concerning third party medicals.

The ministry has advised us that medicals conducted for the purpose of admission or continued attendance at camp may not be insured even when medically necessary, as we reported to you earlier this year

in the OCAsional news.

To paraphrase, the new legislation states that preparing camp medical forms and conducting physicals are not insured, even when medically necessary. The ministry pointed out that the exception contained in the regulations for services considered to be mediccally necessary do not extend to services relating to camp.

The OCA has a copy of the new health regulations in the office for anyone needing further clarification.

Robert "Bob" Secord 1925-1993

Some camp people will not know this name; others will remember Bob as friend, colleague or mentor. Although he was not regularly visable at our Association events, he was a strong influencer of attitudes within the Ontario government toward the value of recreation for all of us. He believed that leisure time pursuits were the right of everyone and where better to learn these skills than at camp.

Bob started working with the Central Y Boys' Club trying to get youth off the streets and into the Y programs. In 1967, after serving as a Regional Recreation Consulant, he became Director of the Community Programs Branch, Ministry of Education and immediately established a position of Consultant, Camping and Outdoor Education. I filled that position which led me to Bark Lake and to the consulting liaison with the OCA. Throughout the years, Bob was articulate about the support camping should receive.

Bob retired three years ago from the Ministry of Tourism and Recreation as Assistant Deputy Minister of the Sports and Recreation Division. He had gained respect provincially and nationally for his untiring dedication to recreation as a profession and a life style; and to amateur sport. Every Canada Games, summer or winter, would find him proudly waving the Ontario flag, marching in the front rank of the Ontario contingent at the opening ceremony.

He was a Founding member of the Ontaro Recreation Society and Sport Ontario. He received Honorary Member or Honory Fellow titles from nearly every provincial and national recreation-related organization. He knew that on May 20, 1993 he was to have been inducted into Canada's Sports Hall of Fame in the category of Builder, again recognizing the individual.

One side of Bob always emerged when a group gathered or when he was asked to speak at a banquet. He would appear with a ukelele, old felt hat, and a miniature saxophone to mimic a Spike Jones or Jimmy Durante recording. It was a hilarious take-off which pre-dated the Karaoke sound systems!!

Bob died suddenly while doing

what he loved most addressing a group of recreation volunteers regaling them with his humour and his philosophy.

The life of Robert E. Secord was a story of uninterrupted dedication to the promotion of Sport and Recreation services to Canadians. Camping has lost a friend and supporter. Mister "Sport and Recreation" will be missed.
